YEAR 3 (Year Abroad)

Students shall spend the third academic year of study in a European University and/or other institution approved by the European Studies Teaching and Learning Committee, where the everyday language used is the target language studied in Level 1.

The student workload will be determined by the ECTS scheme and each student is required to gain 60 ECTS credits by the end of the academic placement year. Students will study a suite of courses agreed between the student, the host institution and the Teaching and Learning Committee. One of the component marks awarded for the year abroad will be for the Year Abroad Portfolio. The weighting of the Year Abroad Portfolio will be 16.6% or ¹/₆ of the total year abroad mark. All remaining component marks will be constituted by the set of modules studied at the host institution. In order to pass the Year Abroad students must achieve an average mark across all courses of 40%.

In the event of a student failing to pass or complete Year 3, the Board of Examiners will allow the student to transfer onto Level 3 of a programme entitled BA European Studies. Regulations for Level 3 are given below.
