Students who have successfully completed Levels 1 and 2 of the MSci/MPhys in Physics in accordance with the Core Regulations may, with the permission of the Chairman or Chairwoman of the Board of Studies in Physics, change their registration to the MSci/MPhys in Theoretical Physics or Physics and Astronomy;

Students who fail to achieve the standard required under the Core Regulations for progression to Level 3 of the MSci/MPhys in Physics but who achieve the standard required for progression to Level 3 of a Bachelors programme may progress to Level 3 of the BSc in Physics or Physics and Astronomy in the Honours or Ordinary stream in accordance with the Core Regulations;

A student who is qualified to progress from Level 2 to Level 3 of the MSci/MPhys in Physics but wishes to transfer to Level 3 of the BSc in Physics or Physics and Astronomy shall be permitted to do so.
