Mode of study: this programme is available full-time and part-time.

Applicants for the programme:

- (a) Must have relevant experience in Community and Youth Work or a related field prior to admission.
- (b) Will be required to demonstrate that they are adequately prepared to study for the award of the degree, diploma or certificate.
 - I Will be required to complete a declaration as to previous or pending prosecutions since they are potentially having unsupervised, substantial access to children and young people. This requirement does not abridge the protection provided by the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act (1974) and a previous conviction would not automatically affect admission to the programme.
- (d) Must supply appropriate academic/ professional references.
- 2. The decision whether a student may be admitted shall rest with the Chairman or Chairwoman of the Board of Studies in Applied Social Sciences.
- 3. Students who are not eligible under the core regulations for undergraduate programmes for progression to Honours Level 2 but who are eligible for progression to the Ordinary degree will transfer to a programme entitled Social and Community Studies, which does not carry professional endorsement.
- 4. The Dip HE in Community and Youth Work (with professional endorsement) is awarded on the basis of work at Levels 1 and 2. In order to qualify for this award students must pass all Level 1 and Level 2 modules. Students on the Ordinary degree who have failed either 20 credits at Level 1 or 20 credits at Level 2 or both may retain professional endorsement for their qualification if the marks for these modules are between 35 and 39%. Students who fail to meet these requirements may not be awarded the Dip HE in Community and Youth Work (with professional endorsement), or proceed to study for the BA Community and Youth Work.
- 5. Students who fail to meet the requirements detailed in 4 above but who nevertheless satisfy the core regulations for undergraduate programmes in respect of the award of a Dip HE shall be entitled to the award of the Dip HE in Social and Community Studies. Students who fail to meet the requirements detailed in 4 above but who nevertheless satisfy the core regulations for undergraduate programmes in respect of progression to Level 3 in either the Honours or Ordinary degree shall be eligible to progress to study for the BA Social and Community Studies.
- 6. Students who wish to pursue the BA in Community and Youth Work (Specialism in Church-based Work) will undertake one of their two fieldwork placements in a church-based setting.
- 7. Students must satisfactorily complete the fieldwork practice modules. Candidates who do not satisfy the examiners in regard to their fieldwork practice may at the discretion of the Board of Examiners be permitted to resit these modules of the programme at a time, place and duration designated by the Board of Examiners.
