BA COMBINED HONOURS IN ARTS (QRV0)

[For students entering before October 2004]

Programme offered at: Durham.

Mode of study: this programme is available full-time and part-time.

- 1. In order to maintain continuity of study, students are normally expected to study modules from the same three or four subjects throughout all three levels. Modules marked # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the Ordinary degree at the next level in that subject.
- 2. Students may not study three languages offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures, or three subjects offered by the Department of Classics and Ancient History.

LEVEL 1 (Certificate)

- 3. At Level 1, students shall study and be assessed in modules to the value of 120 credits, from three or four subjects. All modules chosen must be compatible with each other under the University's timetable; not more than 60 credits may come from one subject. Modules should be chosen from the table of Combined Arts modules below.
- 4. Subject to the approval of the Director of the Programme and of the Chairman or Chairwoman of the appropriate Board of Studies, and to timetable constraints, students may choose modules to the value of up to 40 credits from those available in subjects other than those listed in the table of Combined Arts modules below.

LEVEL 2 (Diploma)

- 5. At Level 2, students are required (unless they are taking either an Intensive Degree or a degree involving approved study at another University) to study and be assessed in modules to the value of 120 credits from three or four subjects, normally subjects to which the Level 1 modules will have led (see note a).
- Modules to the value of at least 60 credits must be chosen from the table of Combined Arts modules below.
- 7. Subject to the approval of the Director of the Programme and of the Chairman or Chairwoman of the appropriate Board of Studies, and to timetable constraints, students may choose modules to the value of 60 credits from those available in subjects other than those listed in the table of Combined Arts modules below. (See Regulation 12 and Note a).
- 8. Students, may from the beginning of Level 2, take an Intensive Degree with the specific permission of the Department whose subject is to be studied intensively. Those permitted to take an Intensive Degree will study modules to the value of 80 credits of the appropriate subject (which must be a subject listed in the table of Combined Arts modules below) plus modules to the value of 40 credits from one other subject.
- 9. Full time students whose Final Honours modules include modules taken from any of the Modern Language subjects are required to insert, as an integral part of their programme between Levels 2 and 3, an academic year spent in a suitable country or countries, in circumstances acceptable to the Director of the Programme in consultation with the Departments concerned. Part time students whose Final Honours modules include modules taken from any of the Modern Language subjects may undertake such a year between Levels 2 and 3.

LEVEL 3 (Degree)

- 10. At Level 3, students are required (unless they are taking either an Intensive Degree or a degree involving approved study at another University) to study and be assessed in modules to the value of 120 credits from three or four subjects, normally subjects to which the Level 1 and 2 modules will have led (see note a).
- 11. Modules to the value of at least 60 credits must be chosen from the table of Combined Arts modules below.

- 12. Subject to the approval of the Director of the Programme and of the Chairman or Chairwoman of the appropriate Board of Studies, and to timetable constraints, students may choose modules to the value of 60 credits from those available in subjects other than those listed in the table of Combined Arts modules below (see note a).
- 13. Students may, from the beginning of Level 2, take an Intensive Degree with the specific permission of the Department whose subject is to be studied intensively. Those permitted to take an Intensive Degree will study modules to the value of 80 credits of the appropriate subject (which must be a subject listed in the table of Combined Arts modules below) plus modules to the value of 40 credits from one other subject.
- 14. Students may take a 20 credit dissertation where these are made available by Departments to Combined Honours in Arts students. Students may not take more than one dissertation module.

Notes:

- a. Modules to the value of at least 60 credits and no more than 100 credits must be chosen in each subject over Levels 2 and 3 together (except for students taking an Intensive Degree, where modules to the value of 160 credits shall be from one subject, and 80 credits from another).
- b. Not all modules will be offered each year. The departmental entries indicate which modules are not available in a given year.

BA COMBINED HONOURS IN ARTS (QRV0) BA COMBINED HONOURS IN SOCIAL SCIENCES (LMV0)

Programme offered at: Durham.

Mode of study: these programmes are available full-time and part-time.

- 1. All module selections must be approved by the Director of the Combined Honours programmes.
- 2. Modules marked # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the Ordinary degree at the next level in that subject.
- 3. At Level 1:
 - All students registered for BA Combined Honours in Arts must take 'Sound, Text and Image', EDUC1011;
 - All students registered for BA Combined Honours in Social Sciences must take 'The Discipline of Social Science', EDUC1191.
- 4. In addition to their core module, at Level 1 all students take modules to the value of 100 credits from at least two and no more than four subjects chosen from the list of Level 1 modules given below. No more than 60 credits may be chosen from any one subject. A student may take up to 40 credits from outside the list of modules that make up the Combined Honours programme.
- 5. At Level 2 students take modules from at least two and no more than four subjects, to a maximum of 80 credits per subject. Students may be permitted to study, at Level 2, modules to the value of 40 credits from the list of Level 1 modules given below.
- 6. At Level 3 students take modules from at least two and no more than three subjects to a maximum of 80 credits per subject. Students may be permitted to study, at Level 3, Level 2 modules to the value of 40 credits from the list of Final Honours modules given below.
- 7. A student may take up to 120 credits from outside the list of modules that make up the Combined Honours programme over Levels 1, 2 and 3.
- 8. A student may not select modules solely from a single Board of Studies.
- Within the Combined Honours programme, certain combinations of modules are known as Named Routes. Students who follow these combinations of modules will be awarded a subject-specific title for their degree.
- 10. Students who follow an approved two-subject Named Route combination, known as a Joint Honours degree, will be awarded either a BA in A and B or a BA in A with B, where A and B are replaced by the approved subject titles. Normally each subject will have a single subject title.

11. In order to qualify for the degree BA in A and B, students must select modules from the same two subjects at Levels 2 and 3 from the list of approved modules for that route. The number of credits in each subject must be no more than 140 and no less than 100 over Levels 2 and 3 together. The availability of subject combinations will be determined by the timetable. In the following tables the following abbreviations apply:

The table above shows the combinations that are currently available (an * indicates that the combination is a Named Route within the Combined Honours programme. Other two subject combinations are possible but will not result in the award of a Named Route).

12. In order to qualify for the degree BA in A with B, students must select modules from the same two subjects at Levels 2 and 3. Modules to the value of 160 credits must be taken in subject A, and modules to the value of 80 credits must be taken in subject B, over Levels 2 and 3 together.

BA A WITH B NAMED ROUTES TABLE

The table above (see note a) indicates which subjects can be combined to form a Named Route 'with' degree (an * in row A and column B indicates that the combination is a Named Route within the Combined Honours programme. Other two subject combinations are possible but will not result in the award of a Named Route).

- 13. Students who follow an approved interdisciplinary Named Route will be awarded a BA in this named route. In order to qualify for this degree, students must select an appropriate combination of modules chosen from the list of approved modules for that route, and in accordance with the prerequisites for progression within that route. The following interdisciplinary Named Routes are available.
 - BA European Studies within the Combined Honours Programme (see Combined entry in the Faculty of Social Sciences and Health)
- 14. Where students who have not taken a BA Named Route have taken modules offered by departments in both the Faculty of Arts and Humanities and the Faculty of Social Sciences and Health, they shall be awarded BA Combined Honours in Arts or BA Combined Honours in Social Sciences dependent upon the balance of credits taken from departments in the two faculties during Levels 2 and 3. In cases where the balance of credits is equal between the two faculties, the student shall be awarded BA Combined Honours in Arts or BA Combined Honours in Social Sciences dependent upon the core module taken at Level 1.
- 15. The degree certificate issued to successful students who have not taken a BA Named Route degree shall list all subjects in which they have taken at least 40 credits during Levels 2 and 3 together of the degree programme.

Modules available within the BA Combined Programme

The modules that form the Combined Honours programme are listed below. Students can choose modules not contained within the programme, provided that no more than 120 credits over the three levels of the degree are from outside the Combined Honours programme. All choices of modules require the approval of the Director of the Combined Honours programme. All selected modules must be timetable compatible.

Students studying within the Combined Honours programme will often progress from one level to the next in a particular subject, whether they are studying for a Combined Honours degree or a Joint Honours degree. Within a particular subject there are often modules that must be taken to allow this progression. In the tables that follow the lists below, these required modules are listed.

For students following a Joint Honours degree, specific modules are often required at each Level and these are listed in the tables below. For students not following a Joint Honours degree, there is often a free choice of Level 3 modules in the final level, unless the tables below specify particular modules.

Year Abroad

Full time students who intend to take Level 3 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures are required to insert, as an integral part of their programme between Levels 2 and 3, an academic year spent in a suitable country or countries, in circumstances acceptable to the Director of the programme in consultation with the Departments concerned. Part time students who intend to take Level 3 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures may undertake such a year between Levels 2 and 3

Students who undertake a year abroad between Levels 2 and 3 will complete a project for each of the major languages they intend to study at Level 3. The project is assessed as part of the Level 2 compulsory module in the appropriate language but passing the assessment is not a prerequisite for progression to Level 3.
