- 2. Mode of study: part-time (24 months)
- 3. Students must have a 2:1 degree with BSL (or external qualification in BSL Level 3) and relevant qualifications and experience which will include native/near native fluency. Relevant qualifications and experience to be assessed by the Language Centre.
- 4. Students for whom BSL is their first language will be required to demonstrate English literacy ability equivalent to IELTS 6.5, to be assessed by the Language Centre. For other non-native English speakers the University's standard English language requirement of IELTS 6.5 will apply.
- 5. Non-native BSL users will be required to demonstrate ability in BSL equivalent to NVQ Level 3.
