DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY/DOCTOR COMMUNITATIS EUROPEAE (DCE) 'Northern European History' (V1A150)

- 1. Applicants may be admitted to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy/Doctor Communitatis Europeae (DCE) 'Northern European History' on complying with the specified requirements of the Core Regulations for Research Degrees by Thesis and Composition and the requirements of these regulations.
 - They must undertake research in a subject approved by the Graduate School Committee and the Northern European Historical Research Network.
- 2. Applicants for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy/Doctor Communitatis Europeae (DCE) 'Northern European History' must complete a minimum period of study at at least two other Institutions within the Northern European Historical Research Network (NEHRN) as specified below: Candidates approved under the provisions of core regulation 6 as full-time students: 1 year.
- 3. Applicants for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy/Doctor Communitatis Europeae (DCE) 'Northern European History' must be graduates of history or a cognate discipline from this or another approved University. They must make an application in the prescribed form for approval as candidates to the Registrar for the attention of the Graduate School Committee and the Department of History on behalf of the Northern European Research Network.
- 4. Candidates for the degree must choose a thesis topic that has a European dimension, and a place within the thematic area of the network. The topic must also require work in European Countries other than that of the home institution, as specified in regulation 2 above.
- 5. The completed thesis will be made available in all institutions included in the Network.
- 6. Candidates for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy/Doctor Communitatis Europeae (DCE) 'Northern European History' shall be examined orally on their thesis and subjects relevant to it. Part of the oral examination must be conducted in a European language other than English.
