1. Programme offered at: Durham
2. Mode of Study: full-time (9 months) or part-time (21 months), commencing in October.
3. The programme is intended for students who hold a BA (Honours) degree or equivalent in another discipline, but who wish to acquire a knowledge of Theology and Religion at a level which would permit them to undertake further study in the area.
