- 1. Programme offered at: Durham
- 2. Mode of study: part-time (24 months) commencing in January.
- 3. Candidates will normally be expected to have at least three years' relevant work experience. Candidates who do not possess a first degree or equivalent will be required to demonstrate, normally through a portfolio of evidence, that they are suitably qualified to undertake the programme. As part of the application process, candidates may be required to submit an essay of 1500-2000 words on a relevant topic.
- 4. Programme of study:
 - a) for the award of MA Business Transformation, candidates must study and be assessed in modules to the value of 180 credits from Sections A, B and C.
 - b) for the award of Postgraduate Diploma Business Transformation, candidates must study and be assessed in modules to the value of 120 credits from Sections A and B.
 - c) for the award of Postgraduate Certificate Business Transformation, candidates must study and be assessed in modules to the value of 60 credits from Section A.
