 - (i) modules to the value of 60 credits from Section B
 - (ii) modules to the value of 30 credits from Sections B, C or D
 - (c) For the award of MA Christian Theology (Anglican Studies) candidates must also study and be assessed in:
 - (i) modules marked α to the value of 60 credits from Section B and modules to the value of 30 credits from Sections B, C or D

OR

- (ii) modules marked α to the value of 30 credits from Section B, a further module to the value of 30 credits from Sections B or C, and a relevant module from within the MA Theology and Ministry #
- (d) For the award of MA Christian Theology (Catholic Studies) candidates must also study and be assessed in:
 - (i) modules marked β to the value of 60 credits from Section B and modules to the value of 30 credits from Sections B, C or D

(ii) modules marked β to the value of 30 credits from Section B, a further module to the value of 30 credits from Sections B or C, and a relevant module from within the MA Theology and Ministry #
