4. Modes of assessment will include written examinations and course work.
5. Candidates in their final year for the MA must submit, by no later than 11 September 2009 (or 1st April 2010 for MA IPP candidates), a dissertation ([EDUC56660](#)) of not more than 15,000 words (including footnotes and bibliography).
6. Candidates who originally registered for the award of MA Education who wish to transfer to the EdD programme must satisfactorily complete all taught modules and have satisfied a Transfer Review Panel derived from the School of Education's Board of Examiners before proceeding to the level 5 compulsory modules and subsequently submitting their thesis.
7. Students who successfully complete the Postgraduate Certificate the Practice of Education (X9KC14) and are admitted to commence the University of Durham's MA Education within three calendar years of completing the Certificate will be exempted from the relevant 60 credits of the MA. Students who successfully complete the Postgraduate Certificate in Education with QTS (X6K114 and X7K214) and are admitted to commence the University of Durham's MA Education within three calendar years of completing the Certificate will be exempted from the relevant 30 credits of the MA. This has no implications for the process of application and admission to the MA which must be carried out according to the approved procedures and criteria.
8. Candidates who exit from the MA following successful completion of 120 credits will be awarded a Postgraduate Diploma Further Professional Studies in Education (X9K512). Candidates who exit from the MA following successful completion of 60 credits will be awarded a Postgraduate Certificate Further Professional Studies in Education (X9K714).
