2. Mode of study: full-time (12 months), part-time (24 months)

4. Modes of assessment will include long essays, test papers, written examination and a dissertation.
5. Candidates in their final year must submit, by no later than 10 September 2010, a dissertation ([CLAS51260](#) / [CLAS40160](#) / [CLAS40360](#) / [CLAS40460](#) / [CLAS40260](#) / CLAS41360) of not more than 15,000 words (including footnotes and appendices, but excluding the bibliography).
6. If a candidate fails a module and does not wish to wait for the time of the next normal assessment for that module, he/she will be given an opportunity to resit the relevant examination(s) or resubmit the relevant work before the end the academic year in which it was originally required, at a time to be determined by the department.

Note: not all modules will be available every year.
