Students who have successfully completed the first two Levels of the Master of Chemistry (International Route) in accordance with the Core Regulations may, with the permission of the Chair of the Board of Studies in Chemistry, change their registration to the MChem (F105) or MChem (Industrial Route);

Students who fail to achieve the standard required under the Core Regulations for progression to Level 3 of the MChem (International Route) but who achieve the standard required for progression to Level 3 of a Bachelors programme may progress to Level 3 of the BSc in Chemistry in the Honours or Ordinary stream in accordance with the Core Regulations;

A student who is qualified to progress from Level 2 to Level 3 of the MChem (International Route) but wishes to transfer to Level 3 of the BSc in Chemistry shall be permitted to do so.

Students whose achievement at the end of Level 3 does not qualify them to proceed to Level 4 may be awarded the degree of Bachelor of Chemistry (BChem) at either Honours or Ordinary level in accordance with the Core Regulations for the award of a Bachelors degree.
