YEAR 3 (Placement)

Students will undertake an approved work placement of not less than 40 weeks or an approved study placement in an overseas university. Combinations of study and work placements will also be possible.

Student progress will be assessed at threshold level by continuous assessment of the student's performance during the placement and a final report. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Economics with Placement Year.
