BA MODERN EUROPEAN LANGUAGES AND HISTORY (RV91)

Programme offered at: Durham.

Mode of study: this programme is available full-time.

Note

Candidates may take modules in one of the following Modern Languages: French, German, Italian, Russian or Spanish.

LEVEL 1 (Certificate)

EITHER

- One 20 credit Core Language module chosen from the Level 1 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures [Please refer to the BA in Modern Languages entry] #
- 2-3 Modules to the value of 40 credits in your selected Modern Language, chosen from the Level 1 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures [Please refer to the BA in Modern Languages entry]

 OR
- 1-2 Core Language modules to the value of 40 credits chosen from the Level 1 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures [Please refer to the BA in Modern Languages entry] # in the case of:

Russian Beginners RUSS1042 40
Spanish Beginners SPAN1072 40

- One 20 credit module in your selected Modern Language, chosen from the Level 1 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures [Please refer to the BA in Modern Languages entry].
- 4 One 20 credit module chosen from sections 1 and 2 of the Level 1 entry for BA in History
- 5 One 20 credit module chosen from sections 3 and 4 of the Level 1 entry for BA in History
- One 20 credit module chosen from sections 1 to 4 of the Level 1 entry for BA in History
- # These modules must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the Ordinary degree at the next Level.

LEVEL 2 (Diploma)

EITHER

- One 20 credit Core Language module chosen from the Level 2 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures [Please refer to the BA in Modern Languages entry] #
- 2-6 Modules to the value of 100 credits chosen in accordance with the following requirements:
 - I. Further modules to the value of 20, 40 or 60 credits in your selected Modern Language
 - II. Modules to the value of 40, 60 or 80 credits chosen from the Level 2 entry for BA in History
- 1-2 Core Language modules to the value of 40 credits chosen from the Level 2 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures [Please refer to the BA in Modern Languages entry] # in the case of:

 Russian Post-Beginners RUSS2012 40
- 3-6 Modules to the value of 80 credits chosen in accordance with the following requirements:
 - I. Further modules to the value of 20 or 40 credits in your selected Modern Language
 - II. Modules to the value of 40 or 60 credits chosen from the Level 2 entry for BA in History
- # These modules must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the Ordinary degree at the next Level.

YEAR 3 (Year Abroad)

Students are required to spend their third year abroad, in a country where the language of their choice is spoken

LEVEL 3 (Degree)

- One Core Language 20 credit module chosen from the Level 3 modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures [Please refer to the BA in Modern Languages entry] ~
- 2-6 Modules to the value of 100 credits chosen in accordance with the following requirements:
 - I. Further modules to the value of 20, 40 or 60 credits in your selected Modern Language
 II. Modules to the value of at least 40 credits and not more than 80 credits chosen from the
 - Level 3 entry for BA in History
 - II. All candidates must submit a dissertation in either Modern Languages or History in Level 3
- $\,\sim\,$ This module must be passed at 40% or above. A mark of 30-39% cannot be compensated.

Notes:

Modules to the value of at least 100 credits and no more than 140 credits must be selected from those offered by each Board of Studies across levels 2 and 3, with a minimum of 40 credits selected from each Board of Studies at each level. All candidates must submit a dissertation in either a Modern Language or History at level 3.
