● At Level 3, only two Level 2 20-credit modules may be chosen, with a maximum of one in each subject area (i.e. in each of Ancient History (modules coded CLAS****) and Medieval/Modern History (modules coded HIST****)).

Modules to the value of at least 40 credits and no more than 80 credits must be taken in each subject area in Level 3 (i.e. in each of Ancient History (modules coded CLAS****) and Medieval/Modern History (modules coded HIST****)).

No more than one Special Subject module may be chosen in Level 3.

Students taking 60 or more credits in History in Level 3 must include within that a 60 credit Special Subject or a Dissertation in History.
