

BSc ANTHROPOLOGICAL MEDICINE

Programme offered at: Queen's Campus, Stockton.

Mode of study: this programme is available full-time and part-time.

- 1. Candidates must have successfully completed the MBBS Phase I, so as to be eligible to progress to Phase II of the MBBS, at the University of Durham or another higher education institution before commencing the BSc Anthropological Medicine.
- 2. A candidate's final degree classification is calculated on the basis of an average of marks gained at this level of study only. Otherwise, final degree classification is in line with the core regulations for undergraduate programmes.
- 3. Performance in the BSc Anthropological Medicine has no bearing upon a candidate's progression from Phase I to Phase II of the MBBS programme.
