Master of Laws (M1K116)

1. This programme is available at Durham City in a full-time (12 months) mode of study.

Admissions

2. English language requirements:
 - a. Students whose native language is not English must show evidence of general proficiency in the English language by normally achieving 7.0 or higher in IELTS or 600 (traditional) or 250 (computer-based) or 100 (internet based) or higher in TOEFL. The former test is preferred over the latter.
