Assessment, progression and award

- 10. The award of MA 'with distinction' will be made to those candidates who achieve an average mark (at the first attempt) of at least 70% in modules to the value of 180 credits and the achievement of at least 70% in the Dissertation (ARCH55360) where that programme route has been chosen.
- 11. The award of 'MA with Merit' will be made to those candidates who achieve an average mark (at the first attempt) of at least 60% in modules to the value of 180 credits where the candidate does not meet the criteria for the award of distinction.
