Modules marked with a ¥ require students to attend three weeks at an excavation specified by the Board of Studies in Archaeology which forms a compulsory component of the Level 2 modules Professional Training ([ARCH2102](#)). This will normally take place during the Long Vacation preceding entry to Final Honours. In addition, students shall be required to attend a further three weeks of fieldwork as approved by the Board of Studies in Archaeology.

13. Only one 20 credit module marked with a ± can be taken at Levels 2 and 3 combined.
