**Assessment, progression and award**

12. Candidates must take a total of 160 credits in Sociology over Levels 2 and 3 combined and a total of 80 credits in Law over Levels 2 and 3 combined;
13. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
14. Modules marked with a \* are not available in 2011-2012.
