Biological Dissertation: *either* Biology, Culture and Society ([ANTH2021](#)) *or* Methods and Explanations ([ANTH2031](#)) *and either* Human Ecology, Genetics and Health ([ANTH2011](#)) *or* Evolutionary Anthropology ([ANTH2051](#)).

Social Dissertation: *either* Biology, Culture and Society ([ANTH2021](#)) *or* Methods and Explanations ([ANTH2031](#)) *and either* Kinship and Belief Systems ([ANTH2041](#)) *or* Political and Economic Organisation ([ANTH2051](#)).
