Assessment, progression and award

7. A student who is qualified to progress from Level 2 to Level 3 of the MANth Anthropology but wishes to transfer to Level 3 of the BSc Biological Anthropology (L620) shall be permitted to do so;
8. A student who fails to achieve the standard requirement under the Core Regulations for progression to Level 3 of the MANth Anthropology (L622) but who achieves the standard required for progression to Level 3 of a Bachelors programme may progress to Level 3 of the BSc Biological Anthropology (L620) in the Honours or Ordinary stream in accordance with the Core Regulations;
9. A student whose achievement at the end of Level 3 does not qualify them to proceed to Level 4 may be awarded the degree of BSc Biological Anthropology (L620) with Honours or Ordinary in accordance with the Core Regulations for the award of a Bachelors degree;
10. A student whose achievement at the end of Level 4 does not qualify them to be awarded the degree of MANth may be awarded the degree of BSc Biological Anthropology (L620) with Honours in accordance with the Core Regulations for the award of a Bachelors degree;
11. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
12. Modules marked with a # must be at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
13. Modules marked with a * are not available in 2011-2012.
