LLB Law (with Year Abroad) (M103)

1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time mode of study.

Admissions

- 2. Admissions criteria:
 - a. This programme is only available to students admitted to the LLB Law (M101) programme;
 - b. Candidates wishing to transfer to LLB Law (with Year Abroad) (M103) must:
 - a. Have successfully completed Level 1 of the LLB Law (M101) and progressed to level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme;
 - b. During the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in Law to be admitted to the LLB (with Year Abroad) (M103) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in Law;
 - c. Successfully complete Level 2 of the LLB Law (M101) so as to be eligible to progress to level 3 of the LLB Law (M101) Honours programme.
