Assessment, progression and award

- 9. Modules marked with a # must be at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 10. Modules marked with a ¥ require students to attend three weeks at an excavation specified by the Board of Studies in Archaeology which forms a compulsory component of the Level 2 modules Professional Training (ARCH2102). This will normally take place during the Long Vacation preceding entry to Final Honours. In addition, students shall be required to attend a further three weeks of fieldwork as approved by the Board of Studies in Archaeology.
- 11. Only one 20 credit module marked with a ± can be taken at Levels 2 and 3 combined.
- 12. Modules marked with a \sim must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 39% cannot be compensated.
- 13. Modules marked with a * are not available in 2011-2012.
- 14. Modules marked Φ will be taught and assessed in Epiphany and Easter Terms only.
