

These programme regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's [core regulations for undergraduate programmes](#).

BA MODERN LANGUAGES (R000)

1. This programme is available at Durham City, in full-time and part-time modes of study.
2. Candidates studying the programme on a part-time basis must take at least one core module during their first year of study at each Level.
3. Provision of modules in Catalan is subject to continued external funding.
4. No more than three languages (including Catalan and Persian) may be studied in any one year.

Level 1 (Certificate)

5. Candidates shall study and be assessed in either:
 - a. Modules to the value of 80 credits taken from one of **Lists A-F** and modules to the value of 40 credits from another of **Lists A-G**.
OR,
 - b. Modules to the value of 60 credits taken from one of **Lists A-F** and modules to the value of 60 credits from another of **Lists A-F**.
OR,
 - c. Modules to the value of 40 credits taken from one of **Lists A-F**, modules to the value of 40 credits from another of **Lists A-F**, and modules to the value of 40 credits from another of **Lists A-F**. *Only full-time students may choose this option.*
6. Part-time candidates must select at least one core module during their first year of study at Level 1 and may study no more than two languages.
7. Candidates must study at least one of their post-A level (or equivalent) languages and may also select from no more than one Beginners Route (**Lists A, D1, E1 or F1**) at Level 1.

8. Candidates shall study and be assessed in either:

- a. Modules to the value of 80 credits taken from one of **Lists H-M** and modules to the value of 40 credits from one of **Lists A, D1, E1, F1** (*only available to students who entered Level 1 in 2011-2012 or earlier*) or **G-M**.

OR,

- b. Modules to the value of 60 credits taken from one of **Lists H-M** and modules to the value of 60 credits from another of **Lists H-M**.

OR,

- c. Modules to the value of 40 credits taken from one of **Lists H-M**, modules to the value of 40 credits from another of **Lists H-M**, and modules to the value of 40 credits from another of **Lists A, D1, E1, F1** (*only available to students who entered Level 1 in 2011-2012 or earlier*) or **H-M**. *Only full-time students may choose this option.*

- 9. Part-time candidates must select at least one core module during their first year of study at Level 2.
- 10. Candidates may only select a module marked with the \$ symbol from a list in which they are taking additional modules to the value of at least 60 credits.
- 11. Candidates may study on up to two beginner routes during Level 2. They may undertake no more than one new Beginner Route (taking modules from **Lists A, D1, E1 or F1**), and may continue on one current Beginner Route (taking modules from **Lists H, K1, L1 or M1**) started at Level 1.
- 12. In accordance with the core regulations, candidates may take no more than 30 credits of Level 1 modules during Level 2; however, an exemption to the core regulations has been granted, for students who entered Level 1 in 2011-2012 or earlier, to allow 40 credits to be taken at Level 1 if those credits are taken from **Lists A, D1, E1 or F1** only, in accordance with paragraphs 8a or 8c, above.

Year 3 (Year Abroad)

13. During their year abroad, full-time candidates are required to spend a period of residence of no less than 7 months in a country, or in several countries, where each of the languages which they intend to study at Level 3 are spoken.
14. Part-time candidates are required to spend at least 4 weeks in each country whose language they wish to study at Level 3. These 4 weeks may be spread over the duration of the programme.
15. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a task, related to residence abroad, for each of the languages they intend to study at Level 3. The tasks form the basis of an oral examination, undertaken at the start of the candidate's final year, the marks for which are part of the Level 3 compulsory module in the appropriate language. Part-time candidates will be assessed at the start of the year in which the Level 3 compulsory language module is taken

Level 3 (Degree)

16. Candidates shall study and be assessed in either:
 - a. Modules to the value of 120 credits taken from one of **Lists N-S**;
OR,
 - b. Modules to the value of 100 credits taken from one of **List N-S** and one 20 credit *optional* module taken from **Lists G, H2, I2, J2, K3, L2 or M3**
OR,
 - c. Modules to the value of 80 credits taken from one of **Lists N-S**, and modules to the value of 40 credits from another of **Lists H-S**.
OR,
 - d. Modules to the value of 60 credits taken from one of **Lists N-S** and modules to the value of 60 credits from another of **Lists N-S**.
OR,
 - e. Modules to the value of 40 credits taken from one of **Lists N-S**, modules to the value of 40 credits from another of **Lists N-S**, and modules to the value of 40 credits from another of **Lists H-M** (*only available to*

students who entered Level 1 in 2011-2012 or earlier) or N-S. Only full-time students may choose this option.

17. Candidates must select, in any given list, at least one *core* module, unless it is stated otherwise. Candidates will normally be required to take the core module(s) for students *following year abroad* unless they have been exempted from the requirement to complete the year abroad in Year 3.
18. Part-time candidates must select at least one core module during their first year of study at Level 3.
19. Candidates may only select a module marked with the \$ symbol from a list in which they are taking additional modules to the value of at least 40 credits.
20. Candidates must select no more than one dissertation module.
21. Candidates may not take any modules marked with the @ symbol at Level 3.
22. Candidates may take up to a total of three translation/interpreting modules, but not more than two translation modules, and only one of French or German Interpreting
23. Where candidates select modules which are delivered in either Term 1 or Terms 2-3 only (**Lists P3, S3-4**), the number of modules taken in each term should be equal, or be different by no more than one (e.g. a candidate may take two modules delivered in Term 1 and two modules delivered in Terms 2-3, or two modules delivered in Term 1 and one module delivered in Terms 2-3, but may not take one module delivered in Term 1 and three modules delivered in Terms 2-3).
24. In 2012-2013, in accordance with the core regulations, candidates may take no more than 40 credits of Level 2 modules during Level 3.
25. From 2013-2014, in accordance with the core regulations, candidates will be able to take no more than 30 credits of Level 2 modules during Level 3; however, an exemption to the core regulations has been granted, for students who entered Level 1 in 2011-2012 or earlier, to allow 40 credits to be taken at Level 2 if those credits are taken from **Lists H, K1+K3, L1 or M1+M3** only, in accordance with paragraph 16e, above.
