Assessment, progression and award

10. Modules marked with a # must be at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
11. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
12. Modules marked with a * are not available in 2012-2013.
13. Modules marked with a Δ cannot be taken in conjunction with each other.
14. Candidates must take at least one module marked with a Θ at either Level 2 or 3 of the programme.
15. Candidates must take both modules marked with a ± at either Level 2 or 3 of the programme.
16. The Dissertation (marked ¥) must be taken alongside at least one other level 3 module in the relevant discipline.
17. Modules to the value of at least 40 credits and no more than 160 credits may be taken in each subject area over Levels 2 and 3.
18. Candidates are able, with the permission of the Director of Studies, to elect to take a module offered by another Board of Studies in an area closely related to Philosophy, Politics or Economics at Levels 2 and 3.
