1. This programme is available at Queen's Campus, in full- and part-time modes of study.
2. This programme is not available in 2012/13.

Admissions

3. Admissions criteria:
 - a. Candidates must have successfully completed the MBBS Phase I, so as to be eligible to progress to Phase II of the MBBS, at Durham University or another higher education institution before commencing the BSc Anthropological Medicine.

Assessment, progression and award

12. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
13. A candidate's final degree classification is calculated on the basis of an average of marks gained at this level of study only. Otherwise, final degree classification is in line with the core regulations for undergraduate programmes.
14. Performance in the BSc Anthropological Medicine has no bearing upon a candidate's progression from Phase I to Phase II of the MBBS programme.
