## Master of Pharmacy (B230)

1. This programme is available at Queen's Campus, in a full-time mode of study.

### Level 1 (Certificate)

2. Candidates shall study and be assessed in the following modules:

### Assessment, progression and award

6. All Modules must be passed at 40% in order to progress to the next level of the degree programme.
7. All Modules must be passed at 40% or above for the award of the MPharm degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
8. All elements of assessment must be passed at 40% or above, or at the specified pass mark for Pharmaceutical Numeracy assessments. There cannot be compensation between items of assessment.
9. All Objective Structured Clinical Examinations (OSCE) and Dispensing Examinations must be passed, at the specified pass mark, in order to progress to the next level of the programme. These assessments will be graded pass/fail only.
10. In accordance with the core regulations, students may exit the programme with a lower award subject to the following conditions:
  - a) On achieving 120 Level 1 credits – Certificate in Pharmaceutical Studies.
  - b) On achieving 120 Level 1 and 120 Level 2 credits – Diploma in Pharmaceutical Studies.
  - c) On achieving 120 Level 1, 120 Level 2 and 120 Level 3 credits – BSc (Hons) in Pharmaceutical Studies.

**Professional accreditation**

11. This programme has been provisionally accredited by the General Pharmaceutical Council.

**Fitness to practice**

12. All candidates must satisfy the programme's defined Fitness to Practice conditions at:
- a. the point of admission;
  - b. at the commencement of each level of the programme;
  - c. at the conclusion of the programme.
