Candidates shall study and be assessed in modules to the value of 60 credits from List A (BA Anthropology Regulations) of which one 20 credit module may be selected from the open Level 3 modules offered by other Boards of Studies and/or one 20 credit module chosen from the modules offered at Level 2 of the BSc Anthropology and not previously taken.

### **Assessment, progression and award**

7. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
8. Modules marked with a # must be at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
9. A student registered for the BSc Health and Human Sciences programme who wishes to transfer to the MAnth Medical Anthropology (L605) and is suitably qualified to do so, in accordance with

the Core Regulations, shall be permitted to transfer subject to the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies.
