Assessment, progression and award

- 7. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 39% cannot be compensated.
- 8. Modules marked with a # must be at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 9. A student registered for the BSc Anthropology programme who wishes to transfer to the MAnth in Biological Anthropology (L607) and is suitably qualified to do so, in accordance with the Core
