Year 3 (Year Abroad)

5. Candidates who have successfully completed 240 credits at Levels 1 and 2 progress to Year 3 (Year Abroad). Such students will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas University (the host institution), taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Anthropology with Year Abroad. Students who are considered by the Board of Examiners in Anthropology to have achieved successful completion (judged by reference to each student's learning agreement), will continue to Level 3 of the BA Anthropology with Year Abroad. Otherwise, students will transfer to Level 3 of BA Anthropology (L602).

A student registered for the BA Anthropology programme who wishes to transfer to the MAnth in Social Anthropology (L606) and is suitably qualified to do so, in accordance with the Core Regulations, shall be permitted to transfer subject to the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies;
- 11. Modules marked with a * will not be available in any given year.
- 12. 10 credit modules can only be taken with corresponding 10 credit module in the subsequent term.
- 13. Modules marked with a _§ may be taken at Level 3 under the adjacent year rule.
