Assessment, progression and award

7. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated;
8. Modules marked with a # must be at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
9. Modules marked with a * are not available in 2013-2014.
10. A student registered for the BSc Biological Anthropology programme who wishes to transfer to the MAnth Biological Anthropology (L607) and is suitably qualified to do so, in accordance with the Core Regulations, shall be permitted to transfer subject to the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies;
11. 10 credit modules can only be taken with a corresponding 10 credit module in the subsequent term.

12. A student who is qualified to progress from Level 2 to Level 3 of the MAnth Biological Anthropology (L607) but wishes to transfer to Level 3 of the BSc Anthropology (L601) shall be permitted to do so, subject to the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies.
