Assessment, progression and award

- Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the next level of the Ordinary Degree.
- The modules 'Hunters and Gatherers Past and Present' and 'Debating Anthropology and Archaeology' appear in both Anthropology and Archaeology lists of Final Honours modules, but may only be counted once.
- Not more than one dissertation may be submitted.
- Students cannot register for one 10 credit module only, a second 10 credit module must be taken in the adjacent term, to equal 20 credits.
- Only one modern foreign language module marked ⊖ may be taken at Level 1 and only one such module over Levels 2 and 3 combined.
- Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
- Modules marked with a ¥ require students to attend three weeks on a placement specified by the Board of Studies in Archaeology. For the Level 2 module Professional Training this will normally

be an excavation placement during the summer preceding entry to Level 2. For the Level 3 module Advanced Professional Training this will normally take place during the summer preceding entry to Level 3.
