- 6. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 20 credits from the Level 2 modules in the entry for BA Sociology;
- 7. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 60 credits from List E in the entry for BA Politics;

8. Year 3 (Year abroad)

During the third year of study students are required, as an integral part of their degree programme, to pursue and be assessed in a programme of study at one of the universities participating in the Year Abroad Programme with the School of Government ad International Affairs. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree, but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Politics and Sociology with Year Abroad. Students who are considered by the Board of Examiners to have achieved successful completion (judged by reference to each student's learning agreement), will continue to Level 3 of the BA Politics and Sociology with Year Abroad. Otherwise, students will transfer to Level 3 of BA Politics and Sociology.

Level 3 (Degree)

9. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List D:

10. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 80 credits chosen from the Level 3 modules in the entry for BA in Sociology and from List F in the entry for BA Politics;
