9. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List D:

10. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 80 credits chosen from the Level 3 modules in the entry for BA in Sociology and from List F in the entry for BA Politics;

#### Assessment, progression and award

11. At least 100 credits and not more than 140 credits must be chosen in any one subject over Levels 2 and 3.



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- 12. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the next Level of the Ordinary degree.
- 13. ¥ The Level 2 module 'Researching the Social' is a prerequisite for the Dissertation in Sociology.
