Year 3 (Placement)

Students will undertake an approved work placement of not less than 40 weeks. They must have successfully completed 240 credits at Levels 1 and 2 to progress to the placement. Student progress will be assessed at threshold level by continuous assessments of the student's performance during the placement and a final report. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Business and Management with Business Placement.

Assessment, progression and award

Candidates who fail to achieve the standard required under the Core Regulations for progression to Level 3 of the BA Business and Management with Business Placement may progress to Level 3 of the BA Business and Management in the Honours or Ordinary stream in accordance with the Core regulations.
- 10. A student who is registered for the Masters in Business and Management with Business Placement programme and who wishes to transfer to the BA Business and Management with Business Placement programme shall be permitted to transfer subject to the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies.
- 11. A student who is registered for the BA Business and Management with Business Placement who wishes to transfer to the Masters in Business and Management with Business Placement and is suitably qualified to do so, in accordance with the Core Regulations, shall be permitted to transfer subject to the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies

12. Durham University Business School is accredited by the European Quality Improvement System (EQUIS) for a period of three years from 2010 and by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) for a period of five years from 2009.
