5. Candidates will undertake an approved work placement of not less than 40 weeks. They must have successfully completed 240 credits at Levels 1 and 2 to progress to the placement. Candidate progress will be assessed at threshold level by continuous assessment of the candidate's performance during the placement and a final report. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Business Finance with Business Placement.
