

These programme regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's [core regulations for undergraduate programmes](#), and the [marking and classification conventions for undergraduate programmes](#).

## **BA ENGLISH LITERATURE AND HISTORY (QV21)**

1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time mode of study. The lead department is English Studies.

### **Level 1 (Certificate)**

2. Candidates shall study and be assessed in modules to the value of 60 credits from List A:

<b>List A:</b>	<b>Credit value</b>
Modules to the value of 60 credits from the Level 1 entry for the <a href="#">BA in English Literature</a>	60

3. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 60 credits from List B:

<b>List B:</b>	<b>Credit value</b>
One module chosen from <b>Lists A</b> or <b>B</b> in the entry for the <a href="#">BA in History</a>	20
One module chosen from <b>List C</b> in the entry for the <a href="#">BA in History</a>	20
One module chosen from <b>Lists A, B, or C</b> in the entry for the <a href="#">BA in History</a>	20

### **Level 2 (Diploma)**

4. In accordance with the core regulations, candidates may take no more than 30 credits of Level 1 modules during Level 2.

5. Candidates shall study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List C:

<b>List C:</b>	<b>Credit value</b>
Modules to the value of 40 credits from <b>Lists B1</b> and <b>B2</b> in the entry for the <a href="#">BA in English Literature</a>	40

6. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List D:

<b>List D:</b>	<b>Credit value</b>
Modules up to the value of 40 credits chosen from the Level 2 entry for the <a href="#">BA in History</a>	40

7. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from **Lists B1** and **B2** in the entry for the [BA in English Literature](#) or the Level 2 entry for the [BA in History](#).

### **Level 3 (Degree)**

8. In accordance with the core regulations, candidates may take no more than 30 credits of Level 2 modules during Level 3.

9. Candidates shall study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List E:

<b>List E:</b>	<b>Credit value</b>
Modules up to the value of 40 credits chosen from the Level 3 entry for the <a href="#">BA in English Literature</a>	40

10. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 80 credits, including **EITHER** 80 credits from List F, **OR** 20 credits from List F and 60 credits from List G:

Modules up to the value of 80 credits chosen from Lists I and K in the entry for the <a href="#">BA in History</a>	0-80
Modules to the value of 20 credits from <b>Lists B1</b> and <b>B2</b> in the entry for the <a href="#">BA in English Literature</a>	0-20
Modules up to the value of 40 credits chosen from the Level 3 entry for the <a href="#">BA in English Literature</a>	0-40
One British History module from the Level 2 entry for the <a href="#">BA in History</a>	0-20
 <b>List G:</b>	 <b>Credit value</b>
Modules up to the value of 60 credits chosen from List J in the <a href="#">BA in History</a>	60

### **Assessment, progression and award**

11. All candidates must submit a dissertation, in either English or History, in Level 3.
12. Over Levels 2 and 3, students must choose credits to the value of at least 100, and no more than 140, from those offered by each Board of Studies.
13. Up to three Special Topic modules in English may be chosen across Levels 2 and 3, but no more than one can be studied at Level 3.
14. Candidates wishing to take Medieval Literature Level 2 (ENGL2031) or Medieval Literature Level 3 (ENGL3031) must have passed at least one of: The Heroic Age (ENGL1041) and The Age of Chivalry (ENGL1051).
