Assessment, progression and award

- 10. Modules marked with # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 11. Modules marked with a ¥ require students to attend three weeks on a placement specified by the Board of Studies in Archaeology. For the Level 2 module Professional Training this will normally be an excavation placement during the summer preceding entry to Level 2. For the Level 3 module Advanced Professional Training this will normally take place during the summer preceding entry to Level 3.
- 12. Only 20 credits marked with a ± can be taken at Levels 2 and 3 combined.
- 13. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 39% cannot be compensated.
- 14. Modules marked * are not available in 2013–2014.
- 15. Modules marked Ω will be taught and assessed in Michaelmas Term only.
- 16. Modules marked Φ will be taught and assessed in Epiphany and Easter Terms only.



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
