CERTIFICATE IN THEOLOGY AND MINISTRY (V60546)

CERTIFICATE IN THEOLOGY AND MINISTRY (V80246) (for students entering before October 2009)

- 1. This programme is available in full-time and part-time modes of study, and is delivered by St John's College (Cranmer Hall), the Wesley Study Centre, and Lindisfarne.
- 2. The following may be admitted to the programme:
 - a) applicants who satisfy an equivalent to the Regulations for Matriculation in the University;
 - b) applicants who can provide evidence satisfactory to the Programme Director that they have pursued a systematic course of study or have equivalent professional training or experience.
- 3. Candidates may apply for APL in accordance with the University Regulations for Accreditation of Prior Learning for undergraduates.

Part-time students must choose no less than 40 credits, and no more than 80 credits, each year.
