## **DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY AND MINISTRY (V60547)**

### **DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY AND MINISTRY (V80247) (for students entering before October 2009)**

1. This programme is available in full-time and part-time modes of study, and is delivered by St John's College (Cranmer Hall), the Wesley Study Centre, and Lindisfarne.
2. The following may be admitted to the programme:
  - a) applicants who satisfy an equivalent to the Regulations for Matriculation in the University;
  - b) applicants who can provide evidence satisfactory to the Programme Director that they have pursued a systematic course of study or have equivalent professional training or experience;
  - c) applicants holding the St John's College (Cranmer Hall) / Wesley Study Centre / Lindisfarne Certificate in Theology and Ministry may apply for direct entry to Level 2 within 5 years of successful completion of the Certificate.
3. Candidates may apply for APL in accordance with the University Regulations for Accreditation of Prior Learning for undergraduates.
4. Part-time students must choose no less than 40 credits, and no more than 80 credits, each year. At the start of each year, part-time students must state the intensity of study with which they wish to undertake the Level. This may not be varied during the period of study for the Level, except by concession.
