### YEAR 3 (Year abroad)

During their third year, students must undertake one academic year of study and assessment at one of the approved partner institutions of Durham University. During this year, at least half of the modules taken at the host university must be in Theology.

### Level 3 (Degree)

- In accordance with the core regulations, candidates may take no more than 30 credits of Level 2 modules during Level 3. Appropriate credit-bearing language modules from the University's Centre for Foreign Language Study may be taken during Level 3, but only if the combined total of language modules and Level 2 modules taken does not exceed 30 credits.
