### Assessment, progression and award

9. Modules marked # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
10. Modules marked ¥ require students to attend three weeks on a placement specified by the Board of Studies in Archaeology. For the Level 2 module Professional Training this will normally be an excavation placement during the summer preceding entry to Level 2. For the Level 3 module Advanced Professional Training this will normally take place during the summer preceding entry to Level 3.
11. Only 20 credits marked with a ± can be taken at Levels 2 and 3 combined.
12. Modules marked ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
13. Modules marked \* are not available in 2013–2014.
14. Modules marked Ω will be taught and assessed in Michaelmas Term only.

15. Modules marked  $\Phi$  will be taught and assessed in Epiphany and Easter Terms only.
