## MA International Relations: Middle East (M9K607)

- 1. This programme is available at Durham City in a full-time (12 months) or part-time (24 months) mode of study.
- 2. Candidates whose first language is not English will normally be required to possess a recent English language test score of 7.0 in IELTS with no component lower than 6.5, or a score of 102 in the TOEFL IBT with no component lower than 25.
- 3. Candidates shall study and be assessed in the following modules:
