BA Economics (Shandong) with Study Abroad (L116)

1. This programme is available at Shandong University, China (Phase I) and Durham City (Phase II), in a full-time mode of study.

PHASE I

Level 1

2. Candidates shall follow a programme of study agreed by Shandong University and the University of Durham, delivered by Shandong University in China, equivalent to Level 1 of the L100 BA Economics delivered by the University of Durham.

PHASE II

Level 2 (Diploma)

3. Candidates shall study and be assessed in the following modules:

Placement Year

5. Candidates will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas University. They must have successfully completed 240 credits at Levels 1 and 2 to progress to the placement, during which they will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Economics in collaboration with Shandong University with Study Abroad.
