Year Abroad

8. During the third year of study students are required, as an integral part of their degree programme, to pursue and be assessed in a programme of study at one of the universities participating in the Year Abroad Programme with the School of Applied Social Sciences. Marks obtained during the placement year do not contribute directly to the degree classification, but overall performance is taken into account, and the Board of Examiners has discretion to raise or lower the classification by one class in cases where the marks achieved during the placement differ markedly from the average performance at Durham.

Assessment, progression and award

13. Candidates may take no more than 40 credits from Level 2 modules at Level 3;
14. Candidates must take a total of 160 credits in Sociology over Levels 2 and 3 combined and a total of 80 credits in Law over Levels 2 and 3 combined;
15. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
16. Modules marked with a * are not available in 2014-2015.

Professional accreditation

17. It is ***not*** possible for candidates who follow this programme to gain exemption for the purposes of legal professional qualification.
