### Assessment, progression and award

- 13. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 14. Modules marked with a ¥ cannot be taken in conjunction with each other.
- 15. At Level 2 a student who fails to achieve the standards required under the Core Regulations for progression to Level 3 of the MArts in Geography (L703) but who achieves the standard required for progression to Level 3 of a Bachelors programme may progress to Level 3 of the BA in Geography (L702) in the Honours or Ordinary stream in accordance with the Core Regulations.
- 16. A student whose achievement at the end of Level 3 does not qualify them to proceed to Level 4 may be awarded the degree of BA Geography (L702) with Honours or Ordinary in accordance with the Core Regulations for the award of a Bachelors degree.
- 17. \* Transfer to the four-year MArts (Geog) degree programme is based on application in Level 2 of the BA programme and places are allocated on a competitive basis, subject to the agreed target course places available. The September Board of Examiners in Geography will rank Level 2 weighted mean results for the cohort of students that applied to transfer to the programme earlier in Level 2. Transfer between programmes is not an entitlement, and is decided by the Board of Examiners in Geography.
