- 8. Modules marked with a * are not available during the 2015–16 academic year.
- 9. The requirements for the award of MSc Arab World Studies with distinction shall be as follows:

- a. the achievement of an overall average mark of at least 70% or more across all Level 4 modules taken in years one and two;
- b. the achievement of a mark of 70% or more in the dissertation and an overall average of 70% or more in the Arabic language modules.
- 10. Candidates for the MSc programme who fail to satisfy the requirements for the award of MSc but who have achieved a minimum of 180 credits at Masters level, including a Masters level pass in the Dissertation, shall be eligible for the degree of Master of Arts in International Affairs (The Arab World) (T6KD07)
- 11. Candidates who have completed year 2 and have not met the requirements for the award of the MSc in Arab World Studies or the award of Master of Arts in International Affairs (The Arab World) shall be eligible for the awards of Postgraduate Diploma or Postgraduate Certificate in Arab World Studies.
