### **Assessment, progression and award**

7. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the next Level of the Ordinary degree;
8. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.

### **Year abroad**

10. Students admitted to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) programme (C605). Students undertaking the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) programme will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity with Year Abroad.
11. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) must:
  - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
  - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the School of Applied Social Sciences to be admitted to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in the School of Applied Social Sciences, and;
  - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) Honours programme.
12. Students who the Board of Examiners for Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) programme.
