Assessment, progression and award

- 12. Candidates may take no more than 40 credits from Level 2 modules at Level 3;
- 13. Candidates must take a total of 160 credits in Sociology over Levels 2 and 3 combined and a total of 80 credits in Law over Levels 2 and 3 combined;
- 14. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 15. Modules marked with a * are not available in 2015-2016.

Professional accreditation

16. It is <u>not</u> possible for candidates who follow this programme to gain exemption for the purposes of legal professional qualification.
